Review & Study: YOUR WORD

A. Review Matthew 7:24

B. Answer the following questions about **Matthew 5:33-37**.

- 2. What does Jesus say that his audience had heard? Where did they hear this?
- 3. In contrast to what they had heard, what does Jesus say (v. 34-36)? How is this different from what they had heard? How is this different from what the world says today? How do you know if someone is telling the truth or putting a "spin" on the truth? Why do people put a "spin" on the truth?
- 4. According to verse 37, what does Jesus say that his disciples should do when they give their word? What does he say that anything more than this is? Why is this so? Why is this so important for us to do?

C. Answer the following questions about Exodus 20:16.

- 1. In what foundational teaching is the instruction of this verse found? Why is this commandment so important for those who follow God?
- 2. What do you think that God meant by what he wrote in this commandment? Is a half truth ever acceptable to God?

D. Answer the following questions about James 5:12.
