#### C. Answer the following questions about Romans 14:17-19.

- 1. What is the Kingdom of God not a matter of, according to verse 17? Why do you think this needed to be said? What is the Kingdom of God?
- 2. What does it say about those who serve Christ in this right way in verse 18?
- 3. What then should be pursued (v. 19)? How does this relate to being a peacemaker?

#### E. Answer the following questions about **Ephesians 2:14-16.**
